Filing For Divorce in New Jersey Based Upon Irreconcilable Differences

Kaley Cuoco, star of the television series *The Big Bang Theory*, filed for divorce from her Husband, Ryan Sweeting citing "Irreconcilable Differences." In New Jersey, a spouse can file for divorce citing "Irreconcilable Differences" under N.J.S.A. 2A:34-2.



This is New Jersey's version of a no-fault divorce. To file a divorce based on irreconcilable differences, the following requirements must be met:

- You or your spouse must have lived in New Jersey for 12 consecutive months before the filing of the divorce complaint.
- You and your spouse must have experienced irreconcilable differences for six months.
- The irreconcilable differences make it appear that the marriage should be dissolved.
- There is no reasonable prospect of reconciliation.

The irreconcilable differences basis for divorce does not require that one spouse make specific allegations of marital fault against the other spouse.
